MINUTES OF REGULAR MEETING July 16, 2014 Conference Room 436 - No. 1 Capitol District Building, Honolulu, Hawaii

I. CALL TO ORDER: Chair Borge called the meeting to order at 9:30 a.m. with a quorum present.

## II. APPROVAL OF JUNE 18, 2014 MINUTES

Second Vice Chair Bennett made a motion to accept the June 18, 2014 minutes, as amended. Ms. Kimura seconded the motion, and the Board members unanimously agreed.

#### **III. NEW BUSINESS**

A. <u>Discussion and Action on Proposed Amendments promulgated by Department of</u> <u>Commerce and Consumer Affairs (DCCA) for Hawaii Administrative Rules (HAR) Title</u> <u>16, Chapter 85, Medical Examiners, Section 8, Examination and Re-examination</u>

Ms. Constance Cabral, Executive Officer from DCCA, explained that the Hawaii Medical Board determined that the current rules are unreasonably restrictive as they bar physicians who would otherwise be qualified from being licensed in Hawaii. The current rules require applicants to pass all three steps of the required United States Medical Licensing Examination within seven years. Ms. Cabral stated that the State's Medical Board considered this rule to be excessively onerous because applicants not meeting this requirement must retake the steps to bring the applicants in-line with the seven-year rule in order to be licensed. Applicants are then faced with the cost of the examination and the time to prepare for it. In order to encourage qualified physicians to practice in Hawaii and to attempt to not exacerbate the shortage that Hawaii currently faces, the proposed amendments delete the subsection(s) of this chapter requiring that applicants must pass all three steps for this exam within seven years.

It was noted that rather than being an impact to small business, the amendments would be more of an advantage, and overall, beneficial as the rules are less restrictive, and are ultimately expected to encourage more, qualified physicians to practice in Hawaii. Ms. Kimura made a motion to move the proposed amendments to public hearing. Second Vice Chair Bennett seconded the motion, and the Board members unanimously agreed.

## B. <u>Discussion and Action on Proposed Amendments promulgated by DCCA for HAR Title</u> <u>16, Chapter 110, Physical Therapy</u>

Mr. Alan Taniguchi, Executive Officer from DCCA, explained that the main purpose of the amendments is to allow the State to license physical therapist assistants (PTA's), as TPA's are currently unlicensed. Hawaii is only one of two states that currently does not have regulations licensing PTA's.

Chair Borge stated that the effect on business looks to be positive.

Ms. Kimura made a motion to send the proposed changes to public hearing. Mr. Ritchie seconded the motion, and the Board members unanimously agreed.

C. <u>Discussion and Action on Proposed Amendments promulgated by Department of</u> <u>Business, Economic Development and Tourism (DBEDT) for HAR Title 15 Chapter 6,</u> <u>Enterprise Zones</u>

Mr. Ritchie stated that the area in which he works at DBEDT, Business Development and Support Division, handles the Enterprise Zones' administrative rules. Mr. Wayne Thom, Community Economic Development Manager, is the manager of these rules. Mr. Thom discussed the history of the rules and noted that since 1997 when he began with the division, the rules have not been changed; therefore, the proposed changes are to bring the rules up-to-date.

The enterprise zone program creates and determines what zones in the counties, chosen by the state, are economically depressed areas. These areas allow businesses to be eligible for a reduction in income taxes and the businesses would be required to create a certain percentage in jobs. There are currently about 270 businesses in this program. Overall, this program only enhances and benefits small business; there is no negative aspect of these rules or of the program itself.

Testifier, Mr. Thomas Smyth, stated that he helped create these rules in 1986 when he worked for the state, and encouraged this Board to support the changes to the rules. He noted that in 1993, Maui was the first county to "opt in" the program with specific census tracts. This program is the only program in the state where the counties have a major role in setting up the program with each county has its own enterprise zone coordinator.

Chair Borge stated that this is a good business program as it encompasses a vast array of industries and assists the economy in creating jobs.

Vice Chair Takamine made a motion to send the proposed changes to public hearing. Ms. Kimura seconded the motion, and the Board members unanimously agreed.

## IV. ADMINISTRATIVE MATTERS

A. <u>Review of Board Member Discussion Leader Assignments for the State Departments and</u> <u>Counties' Administrative Rule Review</u>

Chair Borge stated that in regards to this Board reviewing the rules from the rule-drafting agencies, he thought it best to align the agencies' rules with the expertise and business background of each board member. He distributed a list with suggested agency assignments, noting that it will change when more members come on board; there are also no back-up discussion leaders yet assigned. The proposed list is, as follows:

- Chair Borge Governor's Office, Attorney General's Office, Department of Accounting and General Services
- Vice Chair Takamine Department of Land and Natural Resources, Lieutenant Governor's Office, University of Hawaii
- Second Vice Chair Bennett Department of Agriculture, Public Utilities Commission, Department of Hawaiian Home Lands
- Ms. Kimura Department of Transportation, Department of Commerce and Consumer Affairs, Department of Labor and Industrial Relations
- Mr. Nakamoto Department of Health, Department of Human Services, Department of Human Resources Development
- Mr. Ritchie Department of Public Safety, Department of Taxation, Department of Defense, Department of Business, Economic Development and Tourism, Department of Budget and Finance

# Exhibit 1

Amendment to Chapter 10-4, Hawaii Administrative Rules

\_\_\_\_\_, 2014

SUMMARY

1. A new §10-4-3 is added.

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§10-4-3 General lease; extension of term. (a) The department may extend the term of a general lease of Hawaiian home lands for commercial or multipurpose projects to make improvements to the leased property, or obtain financing for the improvement of the leased lands. Such extension requires approval by the department of a written agreement proposed by the general lessee, or the general lessee and developer, as provided by section 228 of the act.

(b) The general lessee, or the general lessee and general developer, shall meet and satisfy all requirements as referenced in Section 228 of the act.

(c) The lease extension shall be based upon the improvement made or to be made, shall be no more than twenty years, and shall be granted only once.

(d) Before the written agreement is approved, the lessee, or the lessee and developer, shall submit to the department the plans and specifications for the proposed development. The department shall review the plans, specifications, and the written agreement and determine:

- Whether the development is of sufficient value and meets the priorities of the commission to justify an extension of the lease;
- (2) The estimated time needed to complete the improvements and expected date of completion of the improvements; and
- (3) The minimum revised annual rent based on the fair market value of the lands to be developed, as determined by an appraiser for the Department, and percentage rent where gross receipts exceed a specified amount.

(e) The approval of any extension shall be subject to the following:

- The demised premises are used in a manner substantially consistent with the use and purpose for which they were originally leased;
- (2) The rental shall not be less than the rental for the preceding term; and

(3) Any additional terms and conditions set forth
 by the commission and deemed prudent and
 responsible. [Eff ] (Auth:

1. Chapter 4 of Title 10, Hawaii Administrative Rules, is amended by adding a new section to read as follows:

"§10-4-3 General lease; extension of term. Such extension requires approval by the department of a written agreement proposed by the general lessee, or the general lessee and developer, as provided by section 228 of the act.
