Aloha,

The State Procurement Office (SPO) would like to invite you to participate in our initiative to implement a small business set-aside program. Although Hawai'i has a small business set-aside law (HRS §§103D-901 thru 103D-906; Act 50/SLH 2005), there are no current administrative rules implementing the statute since initial interim rules expired without any further guidance. In my discussions with small business advocates, and through subsequent research done by the SPO on this matter, it is clear that the time has come to engage in a process that will facilitate the creation of new administrative rules which will give effect to the State's intent to support small business through procurement.

The SPO wants to move forward on this initiative with the small business community and departmental stakeholders to build a solid foundation for the drafting and implementation of the small business setaside rules. To that end, the SPO is preparing to establish and facilitate a Procurement Advisory Group (pursuant to HRS §103D-213) of skilled and knowledgeable stakeholders of small business interests in Hawai'i. I would like to invite you to participate as a member of this Advisory Group.

The Advisory Group will have a focused agenda, convening its first meeting on October 29, 2014, from 1:00 p.m. to 2:30 p.m., and completing its work before the end of the year. The work of the Small Business Advisory Group will be to provide insight through experience, and identify priorities and key issues that should be addressed as the SPO moves forward in drafting new rules for consideration by the Procurement Policy Board. The SPO will also be formulating a survey to gather metrics and reach a broader range of small business associations and groups in Hawai'i.

Moving forward, it is important that we learn from the mistakes of the previous attempt at implementing the small business set-aside. The new rules should be logical and practical for Hawai'i and our small businesses. Successful implementation will require subject matter expertise with a specialized office that can create and maintain an efficient, supportive, and competitive process for small businesses to contract with the State. With that in mind, I envision the rules to start small and focused, setting realistic goals; a bigger, more ambitious and complex program can be built upon initial successes.

As a leader in Hawai'i's small business arena, I hope you will be as inspired as I am in undertaking this new process and the promise it holds for the economy of our small businesses.
